

# Phillip Island Touring Itinerary Suggestions

## 2 day Itinerary Option C

Total distance: 280 kms from Melbourne CBD

Driving Time: Melbourne to Cranbourne           45 minutes  
                  Cranbourne to San Remo           45 minutes  
                  San Remo to Penguin Parade       15 minutes

Travel time whilst on Island to any attraction maximum 15 minutes

9am Depart Melbourne on the M1 Monash Freeway and make your way to the South Gippsland Hwy.

Travel onto San Remo the gateway to Phillip Island and is home to the local fishing fleet. The village has a welcoming atmosphere with views across Westernport to Phillip Island and Bass Strait.

Cross the bridge and you arrive on Phillip Island in Newhaven. Passing the Visitor Information Centre you will find on the right hand side the delightful Phillip Island Chocolate Factory. Stop and enjoy free samples and view the wonderful array of hand made creations. Enjoy a coffee and some morning tea.

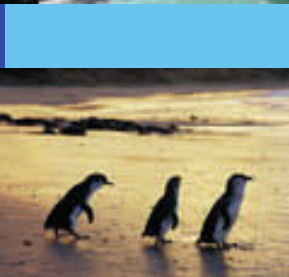
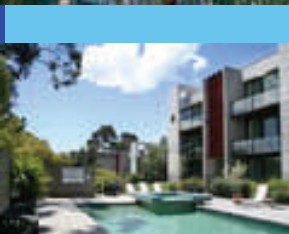
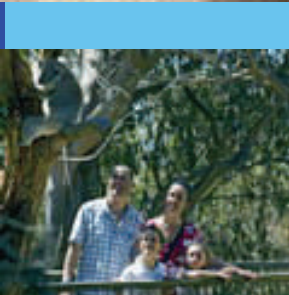
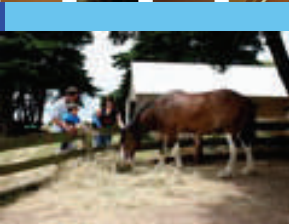
Depart the factory and take the next turn off to Churchill Island where you can step back in time to experience the restored homestead, heritage gardens and a historic working farm with Clydesdale horses, highland cattle and animal nursery.

Enjoy late lunch or afternoon tea at the café taking in views of Western Port.

Visit the koalas at the Koala Conservation Centre, stroll the boardwalks to meet these Australian creatures in their habitat.


Drive onto your accommodation base with a range of resort, apartments, holiday parks and bed & breakfasts on offer you will be in for a restful overnight stay. Enjoy dining at one of the many seaside restaurants such as Harry's on The Esplanade and prepare for your natural encounter at the Penguin Parade.

Travel only 10 minutes by car to the world famous Penguin Parade located at the Western tip of the Island. Visit the visitors centre to learn about these little creatures and their nightly pilgrimage before you head out to the beach. There are a number of penguin parade experiences to choose from including ranger lead experiences and enhanced viewing areas.







## Day 2




Start the day with an invigorating walk at one of the many walking trails including Pyramid Rock.



Visit the home of the Australian Motorcycle Grand Prix at Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit and take an action packed ride in a go kart, or enjoy a behind the scenes tour of the Circuit including the Control Tower and winner's podium. The Visitors centre has a café and History of Motorsport display.



Catch lunch in the seaside village of Rhyll by having your own fishing adventure at the Rhyll Fishing Park. They supply all you need to catch your own fresh trout and can prepare to your liking for the complimentary barbecues or they will cook and serve to you in the dining room.



Depart the Island and include a stop at Grantville to visit Maru Koala and Fauna Park to get up close to wallabies, koalas, wombats and Tassie devils. Enjoy a round of mini golf at the parks course.
